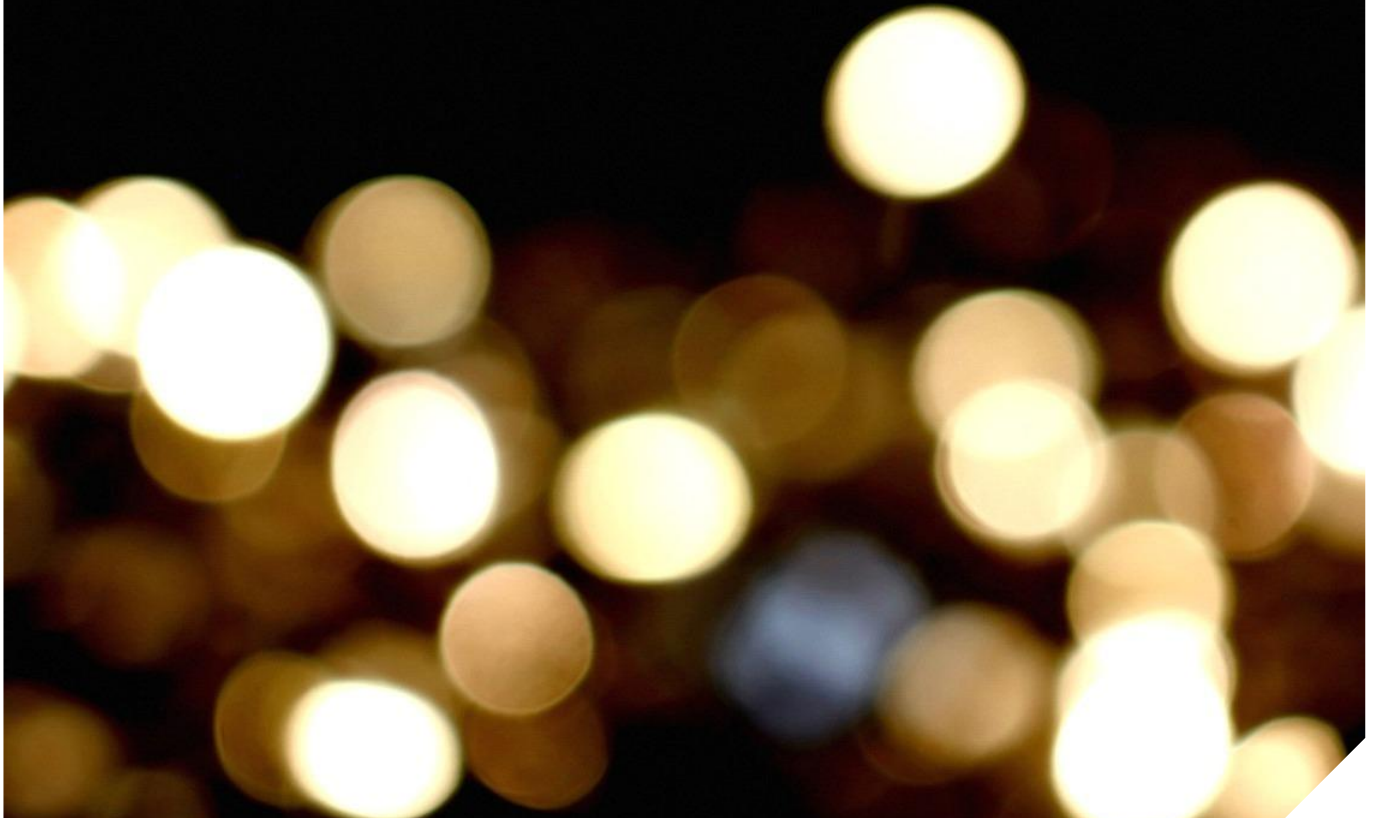

About ASIS

The Australian Secret Intelligence Service (ASIS) is Australia's overseas intelligence collection agency. We are Australia's experts at collecting highly sensitive information – secret intelligence – from sources overseas to keep Australia and our region safe and prosperous.

Our work spans continents and cultures. As a tech-powered and data-driven organisation, we use covert techniques and cutting-edge technology to put us in the right rooms, next to the right people, with the right access to the intelligence we need. We are tasked to collect intelligence – it might be political, military or economic information – deliberately withheld from the Australian Government that might present threats to or opportunities for Australia.

From graduates to career changers, we come from every corner of the country and all walks of life, with backgrounds from all around the world.

Regardless of our ethnicity, experiences and education, we're bound by a shared commitment to something bigger: building a better future for those who come after us. We seek to reflect the community we serve, and welcome applications from Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, women, people with a disability, neurodiverse, people from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds and those who identify as LGBTQIA+.

The role

Strategy and Architecture (S&A) brings our technology teams together to achieve more as a whole than we can individually. Our aim is to provide strategic enterprise vision through principles, guidance and collaboration with technology delivery teams. We expect the selected candidate to have a developed understanding of a broad range of architecture disciplines (in one or more: application, data, integration, security, and infrastructure), strong business skills and critical thinking to assist the Technology Services Division to develop and maintain the ASIS's enterprise architecture.

We are looking for innovative and passionate candidates who are wanting to work with a high-performance team of experts in architecture discipline. The role exercises a considerable degree of independence and must practice sound decision making and judgment to engage in complex problem solving and issues management.

The role of Lead Solution Architect operating at SFIA Level 6 is a strategic leader responsible for the definition, implementation, and governance of ASIS-wide technology solutions. This role provides high-level architectural leadership and thought partnership to executives and stakeholders across the ASIS. The architect ensures that business strategy is enabled through innovative, robust, and scalable enterprise solutions, balancing agility, risk, cost, and long-term sustainability.

Role responsibilities

- Own partnerships with cross-functional technology and design teams to ensure consistent, beneficial client interaction and solution delivery.
- Provide architectural leadership and guidance for sound decision-making by providing expert advice that considers business processes to achieve ASIS objectives.
- Provide solution recommendation that are fit for purpose, adhere to enterprise architecture principles, standards and patterns, leverage reusable components, and are coherent with wider technology domains.
- Collaborate with Enterprise Architecture in developing and maintaining technology strategy, pattern and reference, business process and planning.
- Support the division strategic technology program and related activities that translate into clear architectural direction and guidance on reducing technical debt.
- Participate in architecture governance assurance process to ensure all technology solution design are in alignment with the Division's Enterprise Architecture, consensus and agreed.
- Foster effective collaboration across the National Intelligence Community.

Education and qualification requirements

The following education, qualifications and/or experience will be highly regarded:

- **10+ years** of experience in the IT industry, with at least **5+ years** dedicated to solution or system architecture and must possess significant depth and expertise.
- Tertiary qualification in a technology field is desirable.
- TOGAF 9/10 Foundation or Practitioner is highly regarded.
- AWS Cloud solution architecture experience is desirable, but not essential.

Benefits of working at ASIS

How to apply

Click on "Apply Now" on our website on the role/s that you are applying for. You will be required to submit the following:

- 800-word pitch outlining your skills and experience for the role
- A current CV, no more than 2 pages in length, outlining your employment history, academic qualifications and relevant training that you may have undertaken
- Details of two referees, which must include a current supervisor
