About ASIS

The Australian Secret Intelligence Service (ASIS) is Australia's overseas intelligence collection agency. We are Australia's experts at collecting highly sensitive information – secret intelligence – from sources overseas to keep Australia and our region safe and prosperous.

Our work spans continents and cultures. As a tech-powered and data-driven organisation, we use covert techniques and cutting-edge technology to put us in the right rooms, next to the right people, with the right access to the intelligence we need. We are tasked to collect intelligence – it might be political, military or economic information – deliberately withheld from the Australian Government that might present threats to or opportunities for Australia.

From graduates to career changers, we come from every corner of the country and all walks of life, with backgrounds from all around the world.

Regardless of our ethnicity, experiences and education, we're bound by a shared commitment to something bigger: building a better future for those who come after us. We seek to reflect the community we serve, and welcome applications from Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, women, people with a disability, neurodiverse, people from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds and those who identify as LGBTQIA+.

The role

ASIS is looking for Operational Technology Officer's (OTOs) to conduct technical intelligence operations in support of the Australian Government intelligence mission.

The role of an OTO is dynamic and multifaceted, encompassing a wide range of responsibilities that drive innovation and ensure operational excellence. You will be responsible to capture requirements, plan and execute technical operations both domestically and overseas, often in unique and challenging environments. You will manage risk prior to operations and in the field, reacting to real time changes on the ground.

As an OTO you will take a 'hands-on', professional approach to technical work that is underpinned by relevant academic/trade and work experience. You will stay ahead of the curve by continuously updating your skills and knowledge with superior training. OTOs are drawn from a diverse range of cultural, linguistic, technical and career backgrounds.

Positions are Canberra based with domestic and international travel, and the potential for overseas postings. You will be trained in the use of a range of highly sensitive and unique technical capability, tradecraft, operational planning and methodology to enable you to meet Australia's intelligence requirements. You will oversee the development, maintenance, deployment and operation of technical systems and capabilities.

Role responsibilities

The role can be demanding, but highly rewarding, and ASIS offers a range of extensive support services that contribute to enabling a work life balance, not found in traditional technology roles elsewhere.

- Conduct technical operations utilising a broad range of highly sensitive technical capability.
- Travel overseas/domestically, often at short notice.
- Deliver technical training to non-technical audiences.
- Maintain relevant technical and OTO specific skillsets.
- Work in often austere environments either individually or as part of a team.
- Perform all duties in a safe and secure manner.

Core skills

We encourage applicants with the following skills and attributes to apply:

We are seeking OTOs who can work individually or as part of a team, using a range of state-of-the-art technical systems and capabilities to solve complex problems. OTOs require effective communication and collaboration skills to build crucial relationships with a range of stakeholders from Australia and across the globe.

We require team players who also have the ability to work autonomously, transform ideas into reality and meet tight deadlines. OTOs are a key element of ASIS's intelligence capabilities and highly valued for their unique complex problem-solving skills, innovation and technical capabilities.

Education and qualification requirements

The following education, qualifications and/or experience will be highly regarded:

- Ability to use technology to solve complex problems.
- Ability to adapt and respond in real-time to changing circumstances.
- An ability to communicate complex technical ideas to non-technical audiences
- Relevant and established expertise in one or more technical areas. These could include, but not limited to:
 - Radio Frequency (RF) technologies
 - Cyber and IT Security
 - Computer Networking
 - Electronics/Robotics technologies
 - Audio/Video technologies
 - Digital Forensics
 - Software and Hardware engineering
 - STEM studies
 - Trades e.g. electricians, general fitting and machinist skills etc

Benefits of working at ASIS

ASIS employees enjoy access to generous workplace terms and conditions. Benefits include but are not limited to:

How to apply

- A current CV, no more than 2 pages in length, outlining your employment history, academic qualifications and relevant training that you may have undertaken
- Details of two referees, which must include a current supervisor
- Responses to the following questions outlining your skills and experience for the role on offer.
 1. Tell us about a time you have used technology to solve a problem.
 2. How do your skills and experience equip you for an operational role?
 3. Please provide an example of a time when you have had to change your approach quickly (personal or professional) due to unforeseen circumstances. What was the circumstance, what was the outcome and what did you learn?

Applicants should consider the position description and provide examples which demonstrate their ability to perform the functions of the position. Consider using the CAR (Context, Action, Result) technique when answering.
